

Webinar Series: Student-Centered Coaching with Diane Sweeney

Student-Centered Coaching is an instructional coaching model that focuses on using student evidence to increase the efficacy of teachers, coaches, and most importantly our students. This webinar series will include six, 90 minute webinars that will be led by Diane Sweeney, author of *The Essential Guide for Student-Centered Coaching* (Corwin, 2020), *Student-Centered Coaching: The Moves* (Corwin, 2017), and *Leading Student-Centered Coaching* (Corwin, 2018). Participating coaches, principals, and district leaders will be guided through the implementation of Student-Centered Coaching in today's era of virtual and in person schooling. Attendees are encouraged to purchase their own copy of *The Essential Guide for Student-Centered Coaching* as it will be used throughout the sessions.

- Learn how to launch and schedule coaching cycles

Satisfactory Completion:

Credit for attending a course is based on your signature on the sign in sheet as well as sign out sheet.

All participants must complete an electronic evaluation of the class within two weeks of the session or final session to be sent a certificate. Individual courses may specify additional requirements for satisfactory completion, please check the course description for additional requirements.

Cost Information: Workshop fees are waived for NSSED employees. Participation Fee for Member-District* Employee: \$33 for each session or \$200 if you attend all six sessions. Non Member-District Employees Fee: \$40 for each session or \$200 if you attend all six sessions. All Registration or material fees will be billed directly to the school district that employs the participant after the session is complete or the first session in a series is complete. Individuals are asked to not bring payment to the session.

Cancellations: There is no cancellation fee, though we ask for advanced notice to open the spot for another person. NSSED reserves the right to cancel any workshop due to low enrollment.
